WHY JOIN THE PORTFOLIO PROJECT?

- · Challenge yourself really work a subject or concept
- Create a unified body of work
- Learn to practice the art of self-criticism
- Have two chances for a review of your images
- Present more of your work to the club then you can through competition
- MOST IMPORTANTLY: THIS IS NOT A COMPETITION IT IS A LEARNING EXPERIENCE!

PORTFOLIO STEPS


- Decide on a theme
- Craft an Artist Statement
- Start collecting your images
- Post your Artist Statement and images to the Gallery
- Create a Final Presentation

GETTING STARTED

<u>Sign up</u> by seeing Caesar or Ginger at a meeting. One or both of us will be here from 7:00 so you can sign up before program starts or during the break.


GET A GALLERY PASSWORD:

- Get registered as a gallery user by going to http://nvps.org/gallery/main.php and clicking on register (upper right hand corner). Follow the directions on the screen to get yourself a login and password. https://linear.org/gallery/main.php and clicking on registered user of the gallery then you start at step two.
- Send your gallery user name (not your password) to <u>portfolio-gallery@nvps.org</u> and request Portfolio Project participation.
- You will receive an email confirming creation of your album at which point you will be able to upload pictures as well as comment on other member's pictures.
- THE GALLERY CAN ONLY BE ACCESSED BY PARTICIPANTS UNTIL THE END OF THE PROJECT



TO UP-LOAD IMAGES:

- 1. If you are logged in to the gallery, please log out. This is required as your privileges to the gallery have changed.
- 2. In preparing your image files, please use the "firstlast name_image number from 01 to total" file naming convention for your file names. Example: mikewhalen_01.jpg,mikewhalen_02.jpg, etc. Please do this for the file names, you are free to caption the images as you like.
- 3. Navigate to the link to your portfolio gallery (link below) or to NVPS website photo gallery at http://nvps.org/gallery/
- 4. Click "Login" in the upper right hand corner of the page. You must login to see the portfolio gallery.
- 5. Click on the album "Portfolio Project"
- 6. Click on the album "The 2014 2015 Portfolio Project"
- 7. Click on the album with your name (on the word "no thumbnail")
- 8. Click "add items" in the menu on the left
- 9. Press the Browse button to add individual files (like the digital competition upload).
- 10. Add a caption if you like (optional).
- 11. Press the "Add Items" button at the bottom left of the page to upload up to two files.
- 12. Select "Add more files" from below the file names if you would like add additional files.
- 13. Repeat steps 7 to 10 until all files are uploaded.



CRAFTING AN ARTIST STATEMENT

- Brevity is the soul of wit
- Pique the viewer's interest
- They may read only the title...what does it say?
- Avoid the obscure...if you have to look up the word they will too
- Have a beginning, a middle and an end
- This is not your biography
- Check out the Article on Artist Statements from 'Lenswork' in the January 2013 Portfolio posting

PORTFOLIO GUIDELINES (there are no rules)

Image selection is the most critical part of portfolio development. Begin with your best of the best images from within a theme & from these...

- First, choose your lead image. Start strong 1st impressions
- Next, choose your final image. End strong One to remember you by
- Then, add your Must-Have images (those you can't live without)
- Show versatility (different content, lenses, perspective, visual design)
- "Hide" weakest images in middle & don't group weakest all together (better yet, don't include any weak images in the portfolio)
- Afterwards (let it rest a while) remove redundant images
- Remove anything the least bit marginal
- Get feedback

WHAT DOES A PORTFOLIO HAVE?

- A portfolio should have a thematic focus (except maybe with photojournalism)
- The artist's statement describes the theme / technique (and is not the artist's bio)
- Image selection is much easier once you've written an artist's statement
- A good portfolio size is 10-20 images
- Consistency among portfolio images is important

WHAT DO WE MEAN BY CONSISTENCY?

- Consistent with the chosen theme
- Consistent in quality only the best of your best of the best
- Consistent in style don't mix B&W with color, for example
- Consistent in scale balance numbers if scale varies from wide to macro
- And Remember the portfolio is only as strong as its weakest image

PRESENTATION OF THE FINAL PORTFOLIO

- Digital (laptop)
- Book (bound)
- Folio (loose leaf prints)
- Poster
- Matted Prints

- January 27, 2015 Preliminary Review with input from a panel of experienced club members
- April 15, 2015 Last day to sign-up for the project
- April 30, 2015 Last day to up-load images to your gallery
- May 12, 2015 Final Review
